

Competency Based Logbook in AETCOM, Medical Humanities, Sports and Extracurricular Activities

Logbook for all Professional Years of MBBS

This logbook encompasses AETCOM (Attitude, Ethics and Communication), Medical Humanities, Sports and Extracurricular Activities. It has been designed keeping in mind the requirements of the new Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) Curriculum and is supposed to be maintained across all the professional years of MBBS.

The list of competencies to be included in each professional year and maximum number of attempts allowed for each activity is based on discretion of individual departments in collaboration with college medical education units. Adequate space is provided to enter the details of the competencies and activities, the details of remedial training (if any), the rating for each attempt at the activity and the final decision of the faculty.

The sections on medical humanities, sports and extracurricular activities are designed as **reflective portfolios** with space for reflection writing by the learners. Separate pages are provided for recording the details of any assignments and assessments on these topics.

The records can be used for formative and continuous assessment of the learners as they progress through MBBS. This logbook will serve as a stimulus to encourage self-directed learning among the undergraduate students.

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Salient Features

1. **Simple tabular** format of the templates for recording the activities conducted and competencies and skills acquired
2. **Assessment scale** with only two ratings, 'Scope for further improvement' and 'Satisfactory', thereby emphasising on positive motivation for all students
3. **Flexibility to record** the competencies decided by individual departments and medical education units of each institution
4. **Ample space** in each row to record and assess all activities under a given competency
5. **Reflective portfolio** for recording medical humanities, sports and extracurricular activities sessions with encouragement of reflection writing and recording the details of assignments and assessments.

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Preface

The current Logbook encompasses **AETCOM, Medical Humanities, Sports and Extracurricular Activities**. This logbook has been designed keeping in mind the requirements of the new Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) Curriculum and is supposed to be maintained across all the professional years of MBBS.

The **AETCOM Module** has been incorporated as a longitudinal programme under the new curriculum where **34, 37, 25 and 43** hours have been allocated to AETCOM in the **First, Second, Third Part I and Third Part II Professional Years**, respectively. Correspondingly, the section on AETCOM in this logbook is divided across all four professional years. The 40 hours of AETCOM covered in the Foundation Course need to be recorded in a separate logbook *Logbook for Foundation Course for MBBS Students*.

The list of competencies to be included in each professional year and maximum number of attempts allowed for each activity is based on discretion of individual departments in collaboration with college medical education units. Adequate space is provided to enter the details of the competencies and activities, the details of remedial training (if any), the rating for each attempt at the activity and the final decision of the faculty. The assessment scale has only two ratings, 'Scope for further improvement' and 'Satisfactory'; thereby emphasising on positive motivation for all students.

While the new curriculum includes **Medical Humanities** only under the components of First Professional MBBS, we have incorporated Medical Humanities in all four professional years in this logbook as this topic is closely interlinked with professional development and AETCOM.

A total of 60 and 28 hours have been allocated to **Sports and Extracurricular Activities** in First and Second Professional MBBS respectively under the new curriculum. This section is correspondingly divided across the first two professional years. The 22 hours allocated to Sports and Extracurricular Activities under the foundation course need to be recorded in a separate logbook *Logbook for Foundation Course for MBBS Students*.

The sections on medical humanities and sports and extracurricular activities are designed as **Reflective Portfolios** with space for reflection writing by the learners. Separate pages are provided for recording the details of any assignments and assessments on these topics.
