

Guidelines to use this Logbook

Logbook is a verified record of the progression of the learner documenting the acquisition of the requisite knowledge, skills, attitude and/ or competencies.¹ Successful documentation and submission of the logbook is a prerequisite for being allowed to take the final summative examination (GMER 11.1.1.b.7).²

This compiled Logbook of General Medicine is designed to be used across all phases of MBBS.

What is included in this Logbook?

- 1. Competencies which need to be certified
- 2. All 'show how' level competencies in psychomotor and communication domain
- 3. Provision to record activities related to AETCOM module, pandemic module, skill training, and seminar presentation
- 4. Provision for the reflective writing to benefit students to become an active, aware and critical learner.

Note: Selection of competencies to record in Logbook is at the discrete of faculty/department.

Explanation of the Logbook Table

- ➤ Name of activity: Predefined task to be performed by learner to achieve stated objective or competency. (Note: Multiple sessions may be required for the acquisition of a single objective or competency)
- ➤ **Phase description with date of completion:** Name of phase along with date of completion of activity (e.g. Phase III part I, dd-mm-yyyy)
- **▲ Attempt:** Objective achieved in
 - ♦ First (F) attempt or
 - ♦ Repeat (R) attempt or
 - ♦ Remedial (Re) attempt

Note: Remedial (Re) is a planned activity to rectify the mistakes or problems faced by the learner in achieving the intended outcome.

- **Rating:** The faculty will assess the performance level of learner whether it is
 - ♦ Satisfactory (Meets expectations 'M') or
 - ♦ Need improvement (Below expectation 'B')

Guidelines to use this Logbook

- ➤ **Decision of faculty:** The faculty will decide and mark the status of activity as
 - ♦ **Completed (C)** if objective is achieved or
 - ♦ **Not completed (NC)** if repeat or remedial attempt is given
- ➤ Initial (Signature) of faculty indicating the completion or other determination
- ▼ Initial (Signature) of the learner if feedback has been received

Reflection is a personal response to any new information or experience which enhances critical thinking and learning. Reflective writing is a very powerful tool for teaching-learning and assessment of affective domain.

How to write Reflection

Reflection is written under following three headings.

What happened?

1. What was the session & who conducted it?


So what?

- 2. What key points did I take away from the sessions?
- 3. What interested and motivated me about these sessions?
- 4. What were new skills and information or understanding for me?
- 5. Describe holistic learning (skill, attitude, knowledge, communication, emotional, psychological, all)
- 6. Why I learned what I learned and why I can't learn what I can't learned?
- 7. How I learned best? (Learning style)
- 8. Include both good and bad points and why
- 9. Include both professional and personal gains

What next?

10. How will I use this learning for the benefit of society and will this learning shape me up into a better doctor? Then what ideas I should use immediately and which ones, better for future application?

Reflective writing is based on Gibbs and Kolb's reflective learning cycle: AAAA
